

Know Your Rights as an In-Person Voter



Before You Go to the Polls:

- **Check your registration**
 - Make sure you're registered [HERE!](#)
 - If you're not registered, you can do so [HERE!](#)
 - 21 states and DC allow same day voter registration when you arrive at the polls. Check your state's same day registration rules [HERE!](#)
- **Check your polling place**
 - Due to the pandemic, some polling places may have been moved or consolidated.
 - Some states will allow you to fill-out a provisional ballot, but some do not allow ANY out-of-precinct voters to cast ballots.
 - Confirm your polling place [HERE!](#)
- **Bring required documents**
 - Some states require proof of residence through Voter ID laws. Check your state's rules [HERE!](#)
 - ****It is illegal for any poll worker or poll monitor to ask about your citizenship status or require proof of citizenship****
- **Preview your ballot**
 - Go [HERE](#) to familiarize yourself with what will be on your ballot before you arrive at the polls.

Once at the Polls, You Have the Right to:

- Cast your ballot in private and without interference
- Stay in line
- Receive assistance if you have a disability or difficulty reading, speaking, or writing in English
- An accessible polling place and ADA-compliant voting devices
- Request a paper ballot (especially if electronic voting machines break down)
- Get a replacement ballot if you made a mistake or wish to change your vote
- Cast a regular ballot, instead of a provisional ballot (in most cases) – if you are told you can only cast a provisional ballot, ask what the reason is and where you can check to see if your provisional ballot was counted.
